## **Ornament Exchange**

All participants will draw a number when they turn in their ornament. Ornaments will be chosen in numerical order. If the last remaining ornament belongs to the last person, another ornament will be given to them.

You may wrap your ornament in Christmas fabric, paper, a box, a tin, a gift bag - just choose something attractive that will make someone think your ornament is the best choice.
