Opportunity Basket





Phyllis Campbell suggested this column and it sounds great to me! Her idea is to publish recipes for treats suitable for sharing at a meeting—or maybe

things which were shared and were "Gone in 60 Seconds"!
Phyllis started us off with this recipe:

Apple Cake

1 box spice cake mix1 (20 ounce) can apple pie filling2 eggs1/3 c. chopped walnuts or pecans

Combine all ingredients; mix very thoroughly with a spoon. Make sure all lumps from the cake mix are broken up (suggestion--Use a whisk or pastry blender to make cake mix "silky" before adding other ingredients.)

Pour into a greased and floured (or coated with Pam) Bundt pan. Bake at 350 for 50 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean.

You may substitute any other cake mix or pie filling in this cake for a different flavor.
