January Meeting:

At our January 3rd meeting Phyllis Campbell will be teaching us about watercolor quilts. If you have never tried this technique, or even if you have, you will find it is a lot of fun to do. We will also have a watercolor workshop on Saturday, January 8. The workshop is 3 hours, and you will be able to complete the front of a wall hanging or the center panel of a quilt. We will be learning the shortcut way to make a watercolor quilt, and you may decide to make a wreath, heart, basket or vase of flowers. Cost of this workshop is only \$15 for members and \$25 for non-members. You may sign up at the December or January meeting.

Upcoming Meetings:

February: Our speaker for February will be Jean-Marie (JM) Bunney of the Bunney Hutch in Los Alamitos.

Jean-Marie (JM) Bunney has been sewing for the last 30+ years and quilting for over half of those. Garment and home decor projects eventually changed to personal quilting, contract quilt making and then teaching. She has made over 250 quilts.

After teaching for 13 years, the opportunity to own a quilt shop presented itself and the home-based Bunney Hutch metamorphosed into Bunney Hutch Quilt 'N Sew. Bunney Hutch is located on Cerritos at Denni/Lexington - just across the street from Cypress.

JM has worked for Boeing in HB for 21 years in computer related areas and currently manages the Engineering Release organization for the Delta Rocket program. Computers and technology have always been a part of her professional and home life.

Jean-Marie will discuss her experiences with the technological evolution of quilting tools, materials and styles through discussion and demonstration. Don't miss the meeting on February 7, and bring a friend along.

March: Kris Giannetti of Cozy Cottage will come and speak.

Upcoming Workshops:

January: Saturday, January 8th. The workshop is 3 hours, and you will be able to complete the front of a wall hanging or the center panel of a quilt. We will be learning the shortcut way to make a watercolor quilt, and you may decide to make a wreath, heart, basket or vase of flowers. Cost of this workshop is only \$15 for members and \$25 for non-members. You may sign up at the January meeting.

If you are wondering what you will need for the Watercolor Quilt Workshop on January 8, the following will make an approximately 28" X 28" (plus border and frame), or an approximately 24" X 36" (plus border and frame) rectangle wall hanging or quilt center. If you are not sure about the floral print, samples will be shown at the January 3 Guild meeting.

1. 1 3/8 yards of "Quilt Fuse" or a similar watercolor fusing interfacing. Get the 2" grid if possible. It also comes in 1 1/2", but the 2" is better for this class. Monarch at Wardlow and Norwalk has the 2". M & L has told me they will be getting some. Jenny's has it under the counter.
2. 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 yards of a floral print that has a solid, or near solid background showing around the flowers. There should be good contrast between the flowers and the background. About 1/3 to 1/2 of the fabric should be background. Don't get large 5 or 6" flowers. Look for a print with 1 to 3" flowers with leaves and maybe stems or ribbon. The alternative is to buy 1 to 1 1/4 yards of a fabric with some background around the flowers, but not enough to be able to cut 2 inch squares of background; then match the background with a solid and buy 1/2 to 3/4 yard of the solid.
3. If you want the border to be of the same floral as the watercolor part, then buy about 3/4 yard more of the print, or buy a coordinating fabric for the border-solid or print.
4. If you want a basket or vase, a fat quarter or less of basket weave, plaid, check, marble pattern, or anything else you like will be enough.
5. 1/2 yard of a coordinating solid or near-solid for the framing and binding.

Name Tags:

Don't you wonder who you're talking to or sitting next to and feel uncomfortable asking? In a woman's busy life- how the heck do you suppose we're supposed to remember our own names- let alone 50+ more? We'd like to make that easier! If everyone would wear nametags, our memory problem would be solved! You can make them any design you want—look around the guild and you'll see several variations. You'll notice as you come in that there are stick-on nametags for guests, and for members that forget, they are available for 25 cents.
